Of the many questions that are posed to me on a regular basis as a Rabbi, you may be surprised to learn that I receive more inquiries about Jewish approaches to endof-life than in any other domain. That is why when I was recently approached to consider

offering a class on Jewish Death and Bereavement Practices by our Sisterhood President, Andrea Rabinovitz, and the Chair of our Caring Committee, Debbie Saferstein, I enthusiastically agreed.

On two Sunday mornings this month—Sunday, February 11 and Sunday, February 25, both from 9:30-11:00 AM—I invite you to join me for a two-part workshop entitled "Death and Bereavement: Creating a Community of Comfort." The focus of these sessions will be two-fold: (1) supporting mourners by providing practical

DECEMBER 15, 2023 Patricia Vigder

Patricia Vigder, 89, passed away surrounded by loved ones on December 15, 2023. Patti was born in Wheeling, West Virginia and moved to Akron as a young girl. She graduated from Buchtel High School and attended Flora Stone Mather. Patti was a loving mother to four children.

For most of her life, the Akron Jewish Center was Patti's home away from home. It started when she attended social events on Balch Street as a teenager and continued throughout her adult life, including her 20-year-long career as Director of the Senior Adult Department. Patti was an active member of the Community, a member of Beth El Congregation, and volunteered with many related organizations including *B'nai B'rith* Women, ORT, Beth El Sisterhood and *Hadassah*. She also served as president of Auxiliary and on the Board of Directors at the Akron JCC. Patti had a special place in her heart for Russian Jewish immigrants and worked tirelessly to assist in resettlement efforts in the 1970s, going above and beyond to offer housing assistance, friendship, and a sense of community.

Patti is survived by her children; Steve Vigder, Scott (Pat) Vigder, Sharon Richman, and Shelley (Ira) Gebler, grandchildren; Louis and Miranda Vigder, Lily and Hannah Richman, and Alex and Amanda Gebler.

Bernard "Bernie" Kamenir passed away peacefully on December 21, 2023 at the age of 97, surrounded by his family. He lived his entire life in Akron, Ohio, growing up in the Great Depression, serving our country in World War II, attending the Ohio State University School of Architecture, and creating Kamenir Hamed Architects LLC. While attending Ohio State he played varsity tennis and became president of Alpha Epsilon Pi Fraternity.

Bernie never met a person he didn't like and treated everyone he met with respect and dignity. Bernie was a brilliant art collector, tennis competitor, bridge player, entrepreneur, investor, and runner. His gentle smile and soft-spoken nature drew people into his world where he touched so many lives.

Bernie's immediate family was always a priority for him, especially his beloved wife, Sedell, to whom he was happily married for 67 years. They raised Jeffrey, Steven (Elana), and Lynn (Roy) in a home that was always filled with unconditional love, security, and purpose. information about Jewish traditions and customs; and (2) sharing resources in support of those among us who want to be engaged in the important communal work of comforting mourners.

During our time together, we will have an opportunity to reflect on our personal experiences and explore a number of questions, including (but not limited to):

★ Who is a mourner?

✤ What are the traditional

expectations placed on mourners?
What are the Jewish rituals associated with mourning and

memorializing our loved ones?

★ What expectations should mourners place upon themselves?

★ When and why should mourners say *Kaddish*?

★ What are Jewish practices regarding burial and the days/ months that follow?

* What are Jewish views relating to cremation?

* What do mourners and their families need?

* How does/should the community support those who have suffered a loss?

✤ How can I become active in creating a community of comfort at Beth El? Although these are certainly challenging subjects for us to confront, it is my hope that we will approach our time together productively, transforming our tendency of avoidance and denial (when it comes to preparing for future loss) into positive, proactive steps that can lead to both personal knowledge, as well as creating a framework for Beth El to truly become a community of comfort.
